Best Practices: SOAPE

Subjective, Objective, Assessment, Plan and Education (SOAPE) is the standard format used in CorEMR for clinic/exam visits with patients. There are many features within the SOAPE section that help users gather information into one easy location. Here's how:

Navigation: Tabs across the top of the Sick Call page (SOAPE) give quick access to the patient's open and past sick calls, as well as flow sheets, documents, and chart notes.

Subjective: If a note is opened from a pre-created task, the Chief Complaint is pre-populated. Additionally, all current medications, alerts, problems, and allergies are displayed in this section. Users can either type directly into the text box or use voice dictation medical software.

Objective: Any form labeled as an "exam" form can be accessed here. Once saved, the form is permanently attached to this specific sick call visit.


Assessment: CorEMR requires problem oriented


Feature Spotlight: Flow Sheets

CorEMR has added more standard flow sheets to version 3.4.2. They are: Vitals, Blood Sugar, Detox, Hunger Strike, Coumadin Log, Neuro Checks and Nebulizer. Each of these flow sheets is accessible from the individual patient chart. All results are date and time stamped as well as the user's identification who recorded the results. Note fields can also be recorded. In addition, none of the fields in any of the flow sheets are mandatory. The results are kept as a log and are displayed in chronological order with the most recent entry showing at the top of the list.

Vitals can also be entered as a question on the forms and also in the Sick Calls (SOAPE) section. When data is saved in either of these two places, the results are stored and logged in the flow sheet section under the patient chart. This allows any authorized user to view all vitals in one convenient location.

charting, so each medical task or sick call must have a "problem" identified with it. The assessment portion lists the recent problems this patient has had, and if there is a new problem it can be identified here.

Plan: This section is used for doctor's orders or nurse's observations and includes links to fill out medication orders, to access forms, and to schedule future tasks.

Education: Many facilities are documenting any health related education given to the inmate during the clinic visit. This helps establish consistent care practices.
